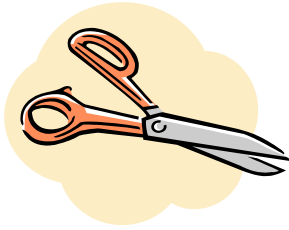

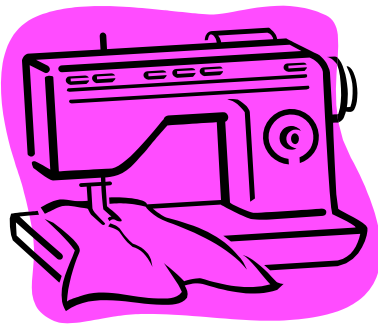

Here are some clarifications on changes made by National for accessing the National ASG website:

National Website: (www.asg.org)

Existing/Renewing members:

If you are an existing/renewing member, the username is the email address associated with your ASG Membership and the case sensitive password of Test. Once you have entered the member's only area, you should change your password to something meaningful to you. If Test or what you think is your password does not work, select "Forgot Password". Enter your email address and submit. Your password on file will be sent to your email in box.

If the message you received is "Entered Username/Password doesn't match, Please try again" your email address may be incorrect or different than you think. Send an email to lindabaker@ameritech.net and I will check the email address for you. I am the only one from the chapter that has access to the INDY Chapter of ASG database.

It is important that you are able to get into the national website to find out what is going on and what discounts you get from different vendors. Sometimes there is a discount code that you need to identify you as an ASG member. I have seen some discounts as high as 50%. We don't want to miss out on those deals!

New Members

If you are a New member, the username is your email address that you supplied on your application and the password is your membership ID#. Once in, the password can be changed.

New Special Interest Neighborhood Groups

We have two new special interest groups. Do you have an embroidery unit to your sewing machine gathering dust in the corner? How about that serger you only use for overlock or a rolled hem?

The Eastside Machine Embroidery Group meets on the 2nd Wednesday of each month at the Irvington Branch Marion County Library at noon. The library branch is located on the southwest corner of E Washington Street and Audubon Road. This year is charted out to be hands-on classes filled with machine embroidery techniques. If you want to bring your machine to actually do the various techniques, you may. If you'd rather come, observe, and take notes, you may do that. The only exceptions will be in June and July. Due to a summer reading program at the library, we will meet on the 2nd Tuesday those two months.

The serger group will meet February 4 at the Glendale Public Library. Unless the library is not available, we will meet the first Tuesday of each month. The time for the meeting will be 5:30-7:30. We have the room from 5- 8:00. This gives us time to set up and clean up before the library closes. The first hour will be a serge and tell with a question and answer period. How did you do that? How was your machine set up? The second hour will be used to discuss a project to be completed by the next meeting of the group. Everyone who participates will be asked to be an active participant. So get that serger out of the box and be prepared to use it. For the February meeting, I will demonstrate my favorite first project- the cosmetic bag. It comes from the book Ready Set Serge. You can purchase it if you want, from Select Sewing Service. See you in February.
